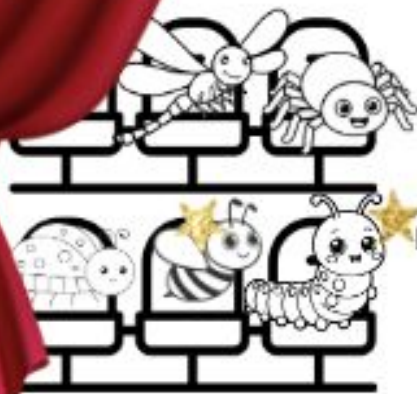

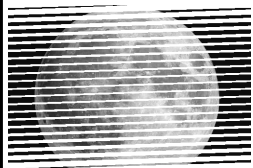

Many people only talk about insect pollination but, there are many more types of pollinators than just butterflies and bees. Let us introduce you to Townsend's Big-Eared Bats, a strange name but a very interesting species of bat. Native to Oregon and unique pollinators, Townsend's Big-Eared Bats contribute to night blooming plants such as honeysuckles, evening primrose, and phlox flowers.

You can find these bats throughout the west and is scattered from the southern area of British Columbia along the Pacific coast to Central Mexico and into the great plains, with a couple in the Central and Eastern U.S.

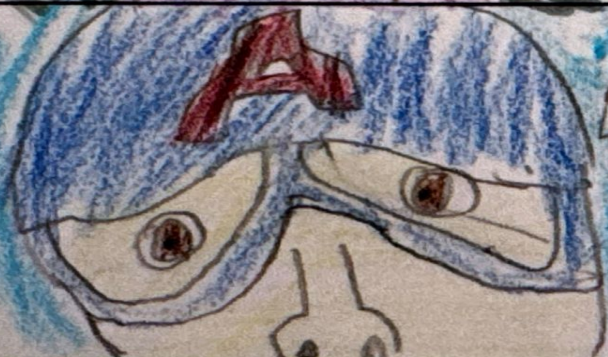

Milkweed is the host plant of the Monarch butterfly.

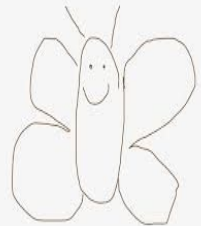
Hey TVS students! This week's pollinator contest is going to be a little different.

On your paper, you must put the same things as usual, and the pollinator your plant hosts. Good Luck!

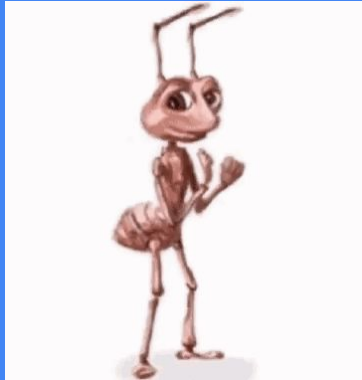
